A. EDUCATION

CHARACTERISTICS OF STUDENTS

The school's target population are students in grades 7-12 (ages 12-22) who are either at-risk of dropping out of school or those who have previously dropped out. The school's definition of "at-risk" encompasses the following

characteristics: *Credit deficient, living in poverty, exposure to substance abuse, teen parents, victims of domestic violence, juvenile offenders, mental and physical health issues, or students identified or suspected of having a specific learning disability.*

ACCA staffing included one (1) Superintendent/Principal, one (1) Treasurer, one (1) EMIS Coordinator, eight (8) educational staff members, which includes six (6) teachers with HQT status and two (2) HQT paraprofessional staff members. ACCA is designated as a Dropout-Recovery School (DORP). Its primary educational program is a standards-based curriculum delivered through a traditional classroom model for students in grades 7-12. Supplemental educational services consisted of work study, capstone projects, and online curriculum for credit recovery.

ACCA contracted school psychological services with the Tri-County ESC. Food services were provided through a contract with Ashland City Schools.

Technology and student data management services were provided by the Midland Council of Governments. Community partners are: Catholic Charities of Ashland, Appleseed Mental Health, Ashland Mental Health and Recovery Board, Ashland University, and Ashland Juvenile Courts.

A. ASSESSMENT AND ACCOUNTABILITY

ACCA provided several assessment tools to monitor student academic performance. These included AIR Tests (for tested core subjects), MAP Tests (fall and spring), and the ACT for all current juniors. ACCA's academic calendar is based on four 9-week grading periods. Students and families were provided with quarterly grade reports as well as daily reports accessible through the school's student data management system (DASL). At the beginning of the academic year and for any incoming student, an audit of transcripts and existing assessment results was performed to determine the appropriate courses and scheduling needs for each student.

Goals/Performance Standards/Measurement:

The primary goal of the ACCA is to ensure that all students will attain an Ohio high school diploma. To achieve this standard of success, the following goals will be established and met:

Goal: All students will complete one or more graduation requirements leading to an Ohio high school diploma.

Standard: 90% of enrolled students will complete one or more graduation

requirements for attainment of an Ohio high school diploma

Measurement: Exit data will be collected to demonstrate number of students attaining diploma

Outcome(s): 23 graduates/School Exceeded Standards per Report Card

Goal: Students will successfully pass one or more parts of the state mandated graduation tests

C. GOVERNANCE AND LEGAL

The Governing Board for ACCA is comprised of five members who are appointed representatives from the community serving two-year terms. The Governing Board held 14 meetings during 2018-2019. Each member underwent annual Sunshine Law and ethics trainings. The Board reviewed monthly financial reports provided by the Treasurer. The Governing Board monitored legislative changes with the Superintendent and implemented or revised its Board policies as required.

MAP DATA ANALYSIS

ACCA was designated as a DORP School by the Ohio Department of Education for the 2018-2019 school year. As required, the school administers the NWEA MAP Test to determine students' annual measurable growth in reading and math. Testing sessions are administered in the fall to gather baseline data and then in the winter to provide comparative data. Below is cumulative data for 2018-2019:
