ACCA follows the A.S.S.U.R.E. curriculum model which is based on learner-centered instructional practices. A.S.S.U.R.E. is guided by measurable goals and focuses on active learning, requiring students to engage in the lessons. Instructional materials are also at the heart of the A.S.S.U.R.E model. Visual aids, technology, manipulatives, project-based learning, and the use of high interest, modified textbooks like the AGS series are among the many instructional materials incorporated into lessons. ACCA's teacher-created lesson plans are tailored to meet students' learning styles, modalities, ability levels, and interests.

Credit Flex/Credit Recovery

ACCA offers different credit flex options that enable students to engage in a wide variety of learning options. These options are online courses, independent studies, testouts, credentialing, and school approved work-based learning. Odysseyware is the primary resource used for credit recovery. This program benefits those students who are in need of credit recovery.
